Below is a selection of the results, as published in The Age in December.

The 'percentage of scores above 40' gives an indication of the proportion of high-performing students. The 'median study score' gives an indication of how the group has performed on average.

I acknowledge the excellent results of our students and commend both school staff and students on their efforts throughout the educational journey. We do, however, always look for growth and pathways provision. That is, as a result of our work, are students learning and are they able to achieve their next steps?

School Council Vacancies:

School council is the governing body of the College. We normally meet on the fourth Monday of the month, for about 2 ½ hours. School council manages the finances of the College, sets strategy and direction, and supports the grounds maintenance and fundraising efforts. Membership provides a great opportunity to see 'inside' the College. Positions on the council are filled by parents, teachers, students and community representatives. In the parent category we have vacancies for three positions of two years tenure and one vacancy for a tenure of one year.

In the student category we have a vacancy for a single position of two years tenure. You might like to talk to your child about being involved in this way. We have a long history of student involvement on school council – they are full members and have a significant input into the direction of the school.

Nominations close on Monday 17th February at 4 pm, with elections to be held after this. Nomination forms are available from the School Office.

New Staff:

It has been great to watch our new staff engage with our community. As a growing school, we have worked hard to obtain high quality staff to join us and our new staff have settled in well and are making a difference for our kids. I encourage you to attend the Parent-Teacher-Student interviews at the end of term and to reach out for a conversation with the teachers if you need support at any time.

Changes at the College for 2025:

For returning students and parents, there are some obvious changes which have occurred for this year:

- We have a new Senior School team, under the leadership of Julie Anderson Senior School Coordinator. Ms Anderson is well known to us and is working hard with the new team to ensure a smooth transition
- We have two new portable buildings the growth of the College was planned for in the rebuilding process and we now have in place a double 'general purpose classroom' near the Senior School, and a new Inclusive Practices Hub near the Wellbeing Centre
- The Wellbeing team have moved to the old Integration rooms, giving them more space to provide support to students in new dedicated meetings rooms. The larger space will also improve their capacity to provide luchtime support to students and to run lunchtime intervention activities.

Compass

Compass is the College's primary communication portal.

It is very important that parents (and students) have set up their log ins and access this tool regularly.

Accessing Compass:

If you have not logged into Compass and don't know how to, please contact the School Office on 5775 2022 or by email mansfield.sc@education.vic.gov.au. We will send you a 'welcome email' (tip: check your junk mail folder, this initial email may be in there) The Office team can also reset forgotten passwords and advise your family code.

Tips:

- Your username is NOT an email address, it is your family code (for a student, it is their student code) eg.ABC0012
- Download the App on your smartphone, it is very handy for a quick review of a timetable or making an attendance note and turning the Notifications ON means you will be prompted when notes are uploaded (saves you missing notes if you don't access your emails very often)
- Some aspects of Compass are only available/or easier to navigate when using a desktop/laptop, rather than a phone (eg. Progress Reports)

Attendance:

Please ensure that all absences are reported. In Compass, you will be able to track your child's attendance and also notify MSC of any absences.

What can I do through Compass?

View timetables, reports, events/excursions inc payments, book Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews, contact teachers directly, view attendance and order canteen etc.

The Office team can answer most of your Compass queries, if not, we will find out for you!

CSEF & Conveyance Allowance

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provides payments for eligible students to attend various activities: school camps, swimming and school-organised sport programs, outdoor education programs, excursions and incursions.

Parents/students holding a means-tested Health Care Card valid on the first day of Term 1 may be eligible. Foster parents and Veterans Affairs cardholders may also be eligible.

Year 7s

Year 7 students that are recipients of the CSEF automatically qualify for the State School Relief uniform package. CSEF and SSR Forms are available from the School Office. Completed forms, with a copy of your Centrelink Card, should be submitted to the Mansfield Secondary College School Office. Conveyance Allowance

If you are an eligible bus traveller and live more than 4.8kms from your closest bus stop, you may be eligible to claim Conveyance Allowance to assist with travel costs.

Forms are available from the School Office. Eligible applicants can either be reimbursed by EFT and paid each term, or your conveyance allowance can be credited to your family account.




Canteen


Compass will soon be available for canteen orders. Students can still place an order at the canteen during first break for lunch.

- Access and use of the \$400 School Saving Bonus via the portal is available until 30 June 2025 for use on textbooks, uniforms or school activities
- Funds not used as of 30 June 2025, will be directed from the Portal to your child's school account for activities such as camps, sports, and excursions
